Meeting called to order at 7:21pm.

Motion made by William Andrews to pass the agenda. Russ DiBella seconds the motion. Motion made to pass the minutes. William Andrew seconds the motion. Minutes pass.

Crime report for the month of April: Lt. Jeremy Tuttle, West Sector.

1. The Royal Lounge shooting occurred while the facility was rented out by an "entertainment group".
2. ABS is currently conducting an investigation; possible administrative charges could follow with potential loss of liquor license. Sgt. Jackie Neuman is conducting investigation.
3. One car theft in last 30 days.
4. Speeding on North Forbes Road has been a concern for Meadowthorpe residents.

Guest speaker, Jeff Wiseman of the Barrel House Distillery, updated residents on the progress of the Distillery District.

1. Barrel House Distillery has been open for seven years now.
2. Possibility of coffee shop moving to the area.
3. In the process of writing grants to restore Town Branch into an urban fishery. Wiseman said the stream can currently support smallmouth bass. The Fish & Wildlife Department would entertain stocking trout and smallmouth bass in the future.
4. Made In Kentucky store is doing well and thriving.
5. Wiseman would like Meadowthorpe residents to get involved with cleanups.
6. The Distillery District will host a Party at Pepper at 4-10pm on the second Friday of each month.

Committee Reports:

1. Community Center: Needs new key holder. Jim Capillo and Michael Stuart volunteered to be key holders. The neighborhood yard sale will take place on June 6 at 8am-2pm.
2. Neighborhood Watch: Low to no crime for the month of April. Lt. Jeremy Tuttle touched on most issues.
3. Natural Resources: William Andrews – Best practices to decrease basement flooding in the neighborhood. City sponsored grants are available to help alleviate flooding in the neighborhood. Three Part Approach to Flooding: Educational workshops, city drainage, and rain barrels/water gardens. Teams of volunteers could help canvass neighborhood to help bring awareness. Mr. Andrews asked for \$105 to cover print cost of educational flyers.

2. Utility work will be finished by Friday
3. Gallery Hop every third Friday
